Home Cultivation Rules

Under Arizona's Smart and Safe Act (Proposition 207):

- Adults aged 21+ may grow up to 6 marijuana plants per person.
- Maximum of 12 plants per household with multiple adults.
- Plants must be in a locked, enclosed space, not visible to the public.
- Cultivation must occur on property lawfully possessed or controlled by the grower.

Possession Rules

- You may possess all marijuana harvested from your legally grown plants at the residence where grown (no weight limit).
- In public, you may possess up to 1 ounce (28 g) of marijuana.
- Of that 1 ounce, no more than 5 g may be marijuana concentrate.
- Possession of more than 1 ounce but less than 2.5 ounces is a civil offense.
- Over 2.5 ounces may lead to criminal charges unless it is from your own plants at home.

Transfer Rules

- You may gift up to 1 ounce of marijuana or up to 6 plants to another adult (21+).
- Transfers must be without payment and not advertised to the public.
- Selling marijuana without a license is illegal.
