

# New Mexico Cannabis Home Grow and Possession Limits

## Home Cultivation Limits

Adults 21 and older may grow up to **12 cannabis plants per private residence**, with no more than **6 mature (flowering) plants per person**. The total household limit is 12 mature plants regardless of the number of adults living there. [1][2][3]

## Possession From Homegrown Plants

There is no specific limit on how much cannabis you may possess at home from your own plants, provided it is **not visible from a public space**. [1][2] However, when outside the home, possession is limited to **2 ounces of cannabis flower**, **16 grams of concentrate**, and **800 mg of edibles**. [1][4][5][6]

## Summary Table

Aspect	Limit Under New Mexico Law
Home Cultivation	Up to 12 plants per residence; max 6 mature per person
Home Possession (from own plants)	No set quantity limit, if not visible from public
Possession Outside Home	Up to 2 oz flower, 16 g concentrate, 800 mg edibles

## Important Notes

- Any sales of cannabis require a proper license; homegrown cannabis is for personal use only. [1][5]
- Violating cultivation limits may result in criminal penalties, including up to a fourth-degree felony. [7][1][6]
- Cannabis stored at home must be kept out of public view to remain within legal limits. [1]
